
Excitement Around Every Corner

February, we moved into the first home and successfully licensed it by the end of March. We are thrilled to have this new addition to our residential living program. We look forward to filling the other homes.



If you have never been to Washington Ranch, 35 miles south of Carlsbad on the Black River, you are certainly missing one of the jewels in the region. Our Washington Ranch facility not only houses sixteen individuals in our services, but it offers a wide variety of options for camping, retreats, meetings, weddings and recreation. This year we opened the Xperience at Washington Ranch which, in addition to the rental facilities, offers entertainment for all ages. The new paintball course has been well broken in with many groups coming to play whether it was a birthday party, church youth group, or friends just wanting to enjoy the game. In addition to the paintball, there is the only Human Foosball Court and GaGa Pit in Southeast New Mexico! You have got to come play!

Organizational Highlights

Support Services

This fiscal year, CARC provided Staff Nursing and Case Management services to 97 individuals. In addition, CARC worked with the Carlsbad Municipal Schools to provide work opportunities to eleven school-age individuals.

Residential Programs

Our ICF/IID homes offer 24-hour care to provide continued support for an individuals daily living needs. Our Independent Living services offer varying levels of care, from intensive support to minimal assistance, based on personal support needs. CARC provided various levels of adult residential services to 68 individuals throughout the fiscal year.

The Supported Employment program is designed to provide employment

Supported Employment

services, training, and supports needed to enable individuals to secure, retain, and/or upgrade employment in the community. This includes services through contracted jobs, job carving, and individual placements. This fiscal year, 27 individuals received employment supports

Adult Habilitation

The Adult Habilitation program provides individuals with various enriching activities including volunteer work, recreational activities, community integration and enhancement of natural supports. At the end of the fiscal year, thirteen individuals were receiving supports through the various levels of Adult Habilitation

Work Services

through our Supported Employment program.

CARC's Work Services program continues to provide employment opportunities and training in a structured work environment to aid in the development of

various vocational skills.

• Grounds and Janitorial

Eleven individuals were working in the Grounds and Janitorial department at the end of the fiscal year. These individuals learn skills related to general housekeeping and lawn care through maintenance of CARC grounds and facilities.

• Dining Hall

The CARC Dining Hall was employing eight individuals at the close of the fiscal year. These individuals assist in the preparation of lunch for the various CARC worksites, serving, and clean-up duties as related to meal service.

• Rainbow Recycling and Secure Document Destruction Services

This fiscal year 934.72 tons of recyclables were diverted from the landfill. Sixteen local businesses held contracts with CARC for document shredding as of the close of the fiscal year. At the end of the fiscal year, Eleven individuals were employed at Secure Document Destruction Services.

Country Store and Greenhouses

The Country Store and Greenhouse held 44 plant rental contracts as of the end of the fiscal year in addition to the wide variety of plants available for public purchase at the Country Store. 31 individuals were learning various horticulture skills through employment at the Potting Barn, Country Store and Plant Rentals as of the end of the fiscal year.


• Pecos Valley Pecans

18 individuals were employed in the pecan processing plant at the end of the fiscal year. Pecans are harvested from our orchards and are known for their premium quality.

Child Development Services

• Child Development Center

The Child Development Center offers childcare services to both typically developing children and those who are at risk or have been identified as having a developmental delay. The center provides childcare services between the ages of six weeks to 36 months. A total of 41 children were provided services through the childcare center this fiscal year.



The Parent Self-Monitoring Screening program assists parents in tracking their child's development to age five. This program is a free service that allows parents to review and monitor their child's early developmental stages. At the close of the fiscal year 229 children were enrolled in the program.

• Early Intervention Program

The Early Intervention Program goal is for young children to increase developmental abilities in an effort to decrease the need for special developmental programs when entering school. Services are provided to children birth to age three who have developmental delays, established

conditions or are identified as at risk medically or environmentally. This fiscal year 424 children were provided early intervention services.

CARC Outcomes

CARC continues to look at ways to provide quality service delivery and work toward continual improvement. We use various methods to collect data that measures the effectiveness of our services, including satisfaction questionnaires, objective tracking, input from various stakeholders and regulatory surveys. This information is used to help us improve services, expand service areas, and become a preferred agency in our field.

- 87% feel that their individual progress plan is helping them move toward their personal vision.
- 83% of individuals in Work Services feel that they are learning skills that will help them get a job in a Supported Employment setting.
- 85% of individuals in the Residential program reported that staff are teaching them what they want to learn to become more independent.
- 73% of individuals in the Supported Employment program stated that they are doing the type of work they want to do.
 - 100% of individuals in the Adult Habilitation program rated overall services as "excellent".
 - 31% of children who are transitioning from our Early Intervention to preschool will not need IEPs when entering the school system.
 - 77% of the children served this fiscal year maintained or decreased their developmental delays based on developmental assessments and evaluations based on developmental skills for their age.
 - Individuals served earned \$407,825.19 in wages over the course of the fiscal year through our Work Service employment sites and contract work.
 - CARC received recognition as an honoree for Albuquerque's Business First Nonprofit of the Year 2014 in Human Services.





Improvements

This year we were able to make several improvements as part of our accessibility and strategic planning process. These projects included:

- New foundation/flooring at the CARC Farmhouse Bargain Store
- Purchasing a passenger van for the Janitorial Crew, a truck for the Grounds Crew and two trucks for use at Camp Washington Ranch to maintain our fleet of vehicles and meet client and business needs.
- Replacement of several aged computers and additional computer for expansion of programs
- Replacement of several aged appliances throughout CARC with new energy star options
- Purchase of a new shredder for Document Destruction
- Purchase of a new office building and furniture for continued expansion of Artesia CDS program
- Construction of and furnishing for the four new ICF homes

CARC Farmhouse Bargain Store

The CARC Farmhouse Bargain Store is run completely by volunteers and offers quality used merchandise that is donated by the Carlsbad community. The Bargain Store assists CARC with replacement of aging vehicles, assists with group home projects, supplies and repairs, and provides funds for special needs requests of individuals served. We are blessed to have such a wonderfully supporting community and volunteers that dedicate their time to the Bargain Store's success. Camp Washington Ranch consists of 4000+ acres and is centrally located near the Carlsbad Caverns and Guadalupe Mountains National Parks. Washington Ranch is a true "Oasis in the Desert." This is the perfect place to hold a wedding, family reunion, company retreat, or just a relaxing stay away from the stress of the city. This past summer we were excited to open the Xperience. The Xperience at Washington Ranch includes a GaGa pit, Human Fooseball course and a paintball
